Visiting three faiths in just three hours! UCC, Buddhist and First Church of Christ, Scientist focus on love

Pastor Tom Caruso, Interim Pastor The Holy Spirit made me to it! That's my excuse for visiting three different faith communities in three

hours on Sunday, June 21.

It was Trinity UCC/Palmyra on live-stream at 9 AM; First Church of Christ, Scientist at its Harrisburg riverside sanctuary at 10:30 AM; the Kalpa Bhadra Kadampa Buddhist Center in the city's Lakeside District around noon.

Trinity was conveniently located on my dining room computer; First Church was a mile walk; the Buddhist Center was two blocks from my front door. Imagine that!

Trinity was exuberant; First Church was subdued; the Buddhist Center was reflective.

To be fair, I caught all of Trinity's 55-minute service; most of First Church's and had just a drop-in visit to the Buddhist center.

I have experienced Trinity 's worship about half a dozen times and always leave feeling blessed! Open doors at First Church, where a dozen listened to lessons on the spirituality of life, drew me inside.

The "We Are Open" sign at the Buddhist Center led me inside for a 30-minute chat.

Wikopedia says First Church of Christ, Scientist was

incorporated by Mary Baker Eddy in 1879 in Boston after her claimed 1866 physical healing that she attributed to reading the Bible. (It is not related, nor has it ever been, to The Church of Scientology)

I left First Church with a message to

focus on the spiritual world and to realize how temporal the physical world, including the body, is. The hymns were simple – people murmured vs. sang – and the live music was piano. As for the Buddhist Center, I know too little to say more.

Is Pastor Tom suggesting you consider another denomination or forgo Christian beliefs, doctrines or worship? Of course not!

Nor is he suggesting you visit such places. I just wanted to share the universal theme I found there: Love!

Whether by prayer, music, song, meditation, Scripture, rites, rituals, sermons or group practices, I felt the Spirit calling me to compassion, peace and the Golden Rule in all three visits.

The call was to love others! Any disagreement there? The world surely needs more love. Are we sensing much love in the news lately? (Is that even realistic in *normal* times?)

How much love, compassion or even understanding do you notice on your television, smart phone, laptop or in the newspaper or on the radio?

Do all the speeches, protests, rallies, funerals, requiems, news programs, radio broadcasts, news releases, government hearings and new laws and blogs seem to be promoting harmony, peace and love?

A better question is how are YOU promoting love, compassion and understanding as Jesus defines them?

Where is God calling you, Redeemer and your family in this movement toward racial, social, economic and civil justice? Is the church part of, or set apart from, these worldwide movements for a more just world?

Not all of us can fully work toward that goal; for some, prayers for justice is the best we can offer.

And it has to be done in Kairos, or God's time, time vs. Chronos, or human's time. *Let's pray into that! The Rev. Thomas W. Caruso is the interim minister at Church of the Redeemer*

Leadership Team Update..

The Leadership Team met on June 11, 2020. We continued to discuss Redeemer's building reopening plan. We created a reopening task force, who has met to begin developing a plan for building usage and cleaning. We are pleased to announce our target dates for reopening. Our Phase 1 opening, on July 5, will begin with Redeemer's worship in the sanctuary. Two weeks later, on July 19, we will begin Phase 2, which will allow all of our support groups to resume their meetings in the building. Then, some time in August, the Life Gospel Chinese Christian Church plans to resume their worship activities. We are working out details to make sure that surfaces and fixtures are cleaned after each group. We will have each group designate a person to organize and oversee the cleaning of their spaces. We will also provide guidelines on traffic flow in and out of the building. Details will be provided as they are

As part of our reopening effort, we have purchased cleaning supplies, hand sanitizer dispensers to be placed throughout the building, gloves to be used for cleaning and offering counting, and we have changed the air conditioning filters. We are working with our cleaning service to make sure that extra attention is paid to surfaces and higher traffic areas in the church. We also have masks that have been generously donated by Life Gospel Church to the Redeemer congregation, which will be available for folks who do not have a mask or forget to bring one to worship.

The installation of the floor in the downstairs mens' room is complete. It looks great, and seems to have really helped with the odor issue downstairs. The flooring company accidentally broke the toilet during the floor demo, and has given us a new toilet as a replacement. We will be placing mats under the urinals and splatter screens in the urinals to help maintain the new floor.

We are very thankful to all the "garden fairies" that have helped out with weeding around the church. This has been a big help. Thanks to George Kapp and Dave Stong who will begin mulching soon. And thanks to Dick Conrad and Tim Conrad for helping out with some maintenance needs around the church. With their help, we've had the outside air conditioning units cleaned, inside filters changed, and the mens' room toilet installed.

The Leadership Team would like to say a huge thank you to our office administrator, Jorja Barton, for her tireless effort and dedication to our church community. Without her, we would not be able to juggle the million and one activities required of our church and wider community. She has been invaluable in coordinating communication with all of our building users and helping us work out many details to keep things running smoothly.

Our completed Profile was submitted to the conference on June 23rd. They can now begin their work of reviewing the document. We have rescheduled our meeting to present the Profile to the congregation on Sunday, July 26 after worship. Copies of the Profile will be available to review prior to the meeting, along with a readers' guide that highlights the important points. We are so pleased to get this important work underway again.

Mike will contact the organ repair company to see how long their estimate is valid, since we had the Covid interruption. The original estimate was good through the summer. The organ repairs will total \$15,482. With the generous donation from an anonymous donor, Redeemer's portion will be \$5,482. We are planning to discuss this with the congregation and determine a financing plan for how we can move forward with these repairs.

Thank you very much to Pastor Tom for continuing to provide pastoral care and outreach to the congregation. Our church continues to stay connected through phone conversations, daily devotionals, and weekly worship videos. We look forward to returning to the sanctuary for worship. We know that not everyone will feel comfortable returning right away, so we are working on a plan to continue with the video worship as well.

Our next Leadership Team meeting will be held on July 9 at 7pm. As always, please reach out to the Leadership Team if you have any questions, comments, or concerns.

Redeemer Reopening Procedures and Guidelines

Though we are still faced with the threat of the Corona Virus, Redeemer is anxious to begin to establish a new norm in both its ministry to our members and to our community. Recently, our Leadership Team established a Reopening Task Force to identify and adopt new building use guidelines and procedures keeping in mind the utmost safety and well-being of all who enter our doors.

Measures are in place to fully prepare the building for reopening on Sunday, July 5. The building will reopen in phases beginning with Phase I and our first worship service in the sanctuary on July 5. Phase II will begin June 19 which will begin the reentry of our Support Group Partners. Phase III is slated for some time in August when the Life Gospel Chinese Christian Church tentatively plans to resume worship activities in the building. **Please note that, in the event of reclassification of Dauphin County by the PA Department of Health and Human Services relative to the virus, this schedule and guidelines are subject to change.**

The following steps were approved by the Leadership Team and are effective immediately.

Redeemer will:

- Provide a "Covenant of Care" doctrine to both church members and building use partners.
- Display signs throughout the church that describe safety and cleaning procedures
- Contract with professional cleaning services to thoroughly clean the building twice per week
- Provide three (3) hand sanitizer stations including: one (1) in the lobby area, one (1) in the hallway just outside of Fellowship Hall(lower level), and one (1) in the East hallway on the first floor.
- Secure cleaning supplies for use in meeting rooms

General Building Use Guidelines

- All are asked to be diligent about establishing protocol related to making sure members DO NOT ATTEND services or meetings if they are ill. Allowing someone to attend who may be ill compromises everyone who meets in the building.
- Masks must be worn while in the building. They may not be disposed in the building following use.
- Entrance and exit to the church must be through the main narthex doors. Only in case of an emergency are other doors to be used. Entrance doors are to be wiped down before and after worship and meetings.
- There will be no congregating in the building before or after a worship service or group meeting. Socially distanced parking lot conversations are permissible.
- Hand sanitizer MUST be used when entering the building and prior to entering a restroom. Per CDC guidelines, hands MUST be washed with soap after restroom use and hand sanitizer MUST be reapplied.
- Each meeting room will be paired with an adjacent restroom. Individuals meeting in certain rooms may only use the restroom assigned to their meeting room.
- The kitchen is closed for the foreseeable future and may not be used for any reason.
- **No food** will be permitted in the building.
- Water fountains will be disabled and covered with plastic; however, individuals are permitted to bring in their own beverages if need be. All cups or bottles must be disposed of following use.

Sanctuary Guidelines

- All hymnals, bibles, offering envelopes, and pencils will be removed from the sanctuary.
- All tables and folding chairs will be removed from the sanctuary except for one that will hold items such as Sunday bulletins and/or an offering box.
- Worshipers are required to remove their bulletins at the close of each service and take them with them.
- The center aisle of the sanctuary will be closed.
- Pews must be entered/exited through the side aisles to help keep social distance and one-directional traffic flow.
- A designated person will help people determine seating areas and will dismiss each row following worship.
- A rotating list of volunteers will assist with seating and offering collection. Job descriptions for these services will be provided.
- Volunteers will be assigned to wiping down pew areas and doors following worship.

Building Use Partner Meeting Room Information and Guidelines

- Due to the uncertainty related to virus vitality on fabric surfaces, all meetings must be held in rooms where surfaces can be easily wiped down and sanitized. For the foreseeable future, only the first-floor classroom and fellowship hall may be used for group meetings.
- Each group will designate a contact person who will organize and oversee that the areas occupied by the group are cleaned following each the meeting.
- Groups will provide Redeemer with the name and contact information for this individual so that periodic updates can be shared with them.

This information is due to the church office by July 15 at <u>info@redeemerchurchucc.org</u> or calling 717-533-7300 M/T/W 1:00 PM – 3:00 PM.

- All porous surfaced tables will be removed from meeting rooms. One plastic topped table will remain and available for group leaders' use during the meeting, or for literature display.
- Chairs will be placed (and maintained) recognizing CDC social distancing guidelines.
- Meeting materials must be packed up and stored or removed following each meeting.
- Redeemer will supply disinfectant, cleaning bottles and plastic gloves for cleaning meeting rooms.
- A cleaning checklist will be provided to each group contact person and posted in each meeting room.
- After EACH meeting, groups will wipe down all touchpoints used by attendees during the meeting. This will include light switches, stair railings, doorknobs and/or door push plates, main entrance doors, etc.
- After EACH meeting, groups will spray chairs, tables, and restroom doors and fixtures (toilets, urinals, sinks) with the disinfectant spray provided.
- Groups are asked to help to provide paper towels to be used for cleaning purposes.
- All trash (coffee cups, water bottles, towels used for cleaning, etc.) must be deposited in the dumpster following each meeting.

Report to Penn Central Conference from the Board of Directors

Greetings, Penn Central Conference,

This past Saturday the PCC Board of Directors met for its quarterly meeting. We were scheduled to meet at our Annual Meeting in Selinsgrove but were unable to gather there this year. The Covid-19 pandemic has disrupted and changed all our lives in ways that we could never have anticipated. We are adapting and learning new ways of connecting and being the church, even as we miss the ways that gathering at past Annual Meetings has enriched and strengthened our life together as Penn Central Conference. We missed seeing all of you this past weekend and pray that you are also learning and adapting to life as we now experience it.

I am sure it will not surprise many of you that the Board of Directors has had to make some heart-wrenching decisions about our beloved camp, Hartman Center. Over the years, we have watched our use of the camp and its financial support gradually decline and have now reached the point where the conference can no longer continue to maintain Hartman Center without further jeopardizing the finances of Penn Central Conference. The pandemic has not helped, but this reality only pushed these decisions to be made a bit sooner. Even before this transpired, it was becoming evident that the benchmarks we had set would not be met and delaying this decision another year would not make a difference while our expenses would continue to grow. We will still have to continue to maintain and secure the property as long as we are the owners.

The decisions we made were not taken lightly, nor were they made without the input and involvement of the individuals related to the oversight of Hartman Center. Members of the Hartman Center Committee of the Board of Directors were involved in many anguishing discussions and finally arrived at the recommendations that were approved by the Board on Saturday. The committee recommendations and the final votes taken by the Board were unanimous. We are deeply saddened that we had to arrive at this point, as we fully recognize the value of the outdoor camping experience for youth and adults, the call to ministry that many have experienced in this setting, and the great love felt by many who have devoted their time and energies to Hartman Center over the years. It is our prayer and great hope that as we move into a new time, we will be able to create and develop new programs for our youth and adults to experience God in the outdoors. We are especially grateful to Zoe D'heedene for her leadership and ministry at this time and to all those who have given devoted leadership to this ministry over the years at Hartman Center. Thank you.

The following motions were approved by the Board in relationship to Hartman Center:

1. UCCR - our camp management company - will be notified of our intent to terminate our contract with them on December 31, 2020. Our contract specifies that we give them 6 months' notice prior to termination. All events planned for this fall will be held, if possible.

2. Hartman Center will be closed on January 1, 2021.

3. There is an anticipated loss of \$93,000 this year that must be covered by Penn Central Conference. UCCR has created a payment schedule that will cover these anticipated losses for about \$5,280 per month This payment schedule was approved by the Board. This amount may go up or down, depending on whether scheduled events happen or not.

4. A committee will be appointed to address the sale of the camp and put it on the market as soon as July 1, 2020. Sale of the property is expected to take time as there are many issue and concerns involved, and the sale may or may not be easy to accomplish.

A day of celebration will be planned at Hartman Center on

October 10, 2020. Put this date on your calendar and plan to come and help us celebrate and say good-by. More information will be coming.

The Board will meet again in several weeks to affirm the make-up of the sale committee and also to recommend a 2021 proposed budget for the Conference for approval at our August 29 Annual Meeting.



I wish I had better news, but please know that we want to hear from you, we care about your concerns and feelings, and want you to be involved in the planning as we move ahead. We hope that you will engage with your local association board members, as they represent you on the Conference Board. I will reiterate that the Board was unanimous in making these decisions and we will take full responsibility for them. The Conference by-laws clearly charge the Board with the oversight, management, and decisions regarding all the assets and properties of the Conference.
